How does our school protect the children?

There are many different ways to keep our children safe but one of the main reasons are making the children know that they have someone to talk to.

Sexual abuse

Sexual abuse is:

Touching you in private places
Making you watch things that you shouldn't
Making you act in a naughty way
Remember the pants rule! NSPCC

Bullying

Bullying is when someone is hurting you over and over again.

There are three types of bullying physical, verbal and online

If the children see bullying they will report the problem to a trusted adult and we will sort it out.



Emotional abuse

This means where someone is deliberately making you feel bad and worthless. We make children understand that they are not alone and that they can speak to us. You should always tell someone who you trust. It doesn't matter whether in or out of school.
