Democracy

- 👉 Each year the children decide upon their class school council representative and the rights and responsibilities associated. All the children contribute through a manifesto
- 👉 Children have many opportunities for their voices to be heard. We have a school council which meets regularly to discuss issues raised in class council meetings. The council has its own budget and is able to genuinely effect change within the school
- 👉 Children have a termly questionnaire with which they are able to put forward their views about the school.

The Rule of Law

- 👉 The importance of laws or rules, whether they be those that govern the class, the school, or the country, are consistently reinforced throughout regular school days, as well as when dealing with inappropriate behaviour and through school collective worship
- 👉 Pupils are taught the Christian values and reasons behind laws, that they govern and protect us, the responsibilities that this involves and the consequences when laws are broken.

Individual Liberty

- 👉 Within school, pupils are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment
- 👉 As a school we educate and provide boundaries for young pupils to make choices safely, through provision of a safe environment and empowering education.
- 👉 Pupils are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and advised how to exercise these safely, for example through our E-Safety and PSHE lessons. Whether it be through choice of learning challenge, or participation in our numerous extra-curricular clubs and opportunities, pupils are given the freedom to make choices.

Mutual Respect

- 👉 Children learn that their behaviour has an effect on their own rights and those of others.
- 👉 All members of the school community treat each other with respect.

Tolerance of those of Different Faiths and Beliefs

- 👉 Hartshorne is situated in an area which is not greatly culturally diverse; therefore we place a great emphasis on promoting diversity with the children.
- 👉 Collective worship and topics are regularly planned to address this issue either directly or through the inclusion of stories and celebrations from a variety of faiths and cultures. Our RE, PSHE and Collective Worship teaching reinforce this.
- 👉 Members of different faiths or religions are encouraged to share their knowledge to enhance learning within classes and the school.
- 👉 Children visit places of worship that are important to different faiths.

At Hartshorne C of E Primary School we will actively challenge pupils, staff or parents expressing opinions contrary to fundamental British Values, including ‘extremist’ views.
